#### Classroom Management Plan

1. Course Overview: CTE Digital Media is a two consecutive period full-year course that offers students the opportunity to take their filmmaking skills into a professional setting. CTE Digital Media/Video Production allows the student to build and expand upon their previously acquired skills. Through a series of written, produced, and presented assignment work; the students will examine theory and hands-on production experience to learn the ins and outs of movie production with both Studio/Hollywood and Independent Filmmaking Techniques. The student will take on more responsibility and become actively engaged in the maintenance, repair, and organization of the equipment used in the program. The class is run like a production company and all students will take ownership and responsibility for the classroom endeavors as a whole. In other words, the students are responsible for making the class their own collective vision.

#### 1. Student Requirements:

A **composition notebook or three-ring binder** is required. This must be brought to class everyday for exercises and a running idea journal. Not having this notebook will result in points deducted from participation grade. The student must always have paper and a pen or pencil to take notes. Coming to class unprepared to take notes will affect your participation grade.

The student is responsible for keeping up with assignments. Assignment dates will be explicitly communicated to students either in class or online. If you are absent, it is your responsibility to find out what you missed. I will not chase you down.

You must be available and various times during the year to give of your time to help with various events and projects outside of class hours. This is an investment in the betterment of the program and part of your Intern Hours. These hours can manifest themselves in various ways throughout the year. Please be eager to help out and volunteer your time. This is a

### 1. Student Behavior Responsibilities:

NO SKATEBOARDS IN THE CLASSROOM. You must find another place for your skateboard (racks are provided outside of the 600 building)

Students will be excused from any late assignments only with a signed note from a parent or guardian.

All missed work will be expected to be made up or a zero will be given.

All assignments must be turned in on time, neat and with the student's name on it. Late assignments will be docked a letter grade for each day they are late.

The consequence for violating any of the above rules will result in one hour of detention, Saturday School or expulsion from the program depending on the degree of the violation.
